

Synopsis

"Behavioral Issues in Horses: Why Do They Do That?" is a valuable resource for anyone who has experienced the fear or frustration of their horse exhibiting dangerous/undesirable behaviors. Through personal accounts that are both entertaining and educational, author and horse trainer Nicole Brickner covers the most common behavioral issues horses develop, including bucking, kicking, rearing, biting, bolting, and more. She begins by describing natural horse behavior and why horses behave the way they do, and then explains how we can use this knowledge to work with a horse on a level it can understand. Next, she explores the possible physical, behavioral, and emotional causes of the various behaviors, and explains how the solution to a particular behavior can be very different depending on which of those possible causes is the root of the issue. In this unique approach, the root causes are recognized as originating from either physical (pain, hunger, etc.), behavioral (choice, conditioning, habit), or emotional (fear, anger, instinct) sources. Depending on which of these triggers is causing the issue, the path to resolving the behavior is very different. Finally, Nicole explains how to address the various behaviors, with dozens of stories based on her own experiences that illustrate solutions to each behavior, for each possible root cause. If there are horses in your life, youâ€™ll enjoy the insights and adventures in "Behavioral Issues in Horses: Why Do They Do That?"

I have experienced the frustration of not knowing how to manage bad behavior from my horse. I have excused bad behavior as cute or endearing then I have been confused when bad behavior escalates and frightens me. I have not known if it was caused by me or my horse. My shelves are full of books about horses, horse behavior, horse management, etc. and I have gleaned some bits of information

from each one of them. This book, *Behavioral Issues in Horses: Why Do They Do That?* written by Nicole Brickner, is different. From the touching and heartfelt forward through the afterword there was a consistent message that imparted the value and benefits of understanding the instinctual nature of the horse as it relates to the continually developing relationship between horse and human. Nicole respects horses and understands their nature and motivations. While not a "how to" book, the author communicates her message by providing many practical examples of understanding and then managing behavioral issues. I found some that could have been *My story!* Some stories will make you laugh and some will make you reflect on your own behaviors and how they impact your horse. Some stories may help you have a different perspective on your horse's behavior and motivate you to try something new rather than experiencing ongoing frustration or behavioral escalation by both horse and owner. I'm not great at writing reviews and don't normally take the time to write them but I think this book is a gem! It is very well written. The foundation of information is very practical and based on experience. If you are interested in better understanding your horse, improving your relationship with your horse and improving your horse's performance and consistency this book is well worth your time. Your horse will thank you!
