

Lovely book, I've been wanting to weave a Shaker rug for ages. All the info you need to reproduce one, including the colors of dyes to use but I see no reason to stop there if a reproduction is not what you want. A spinning wheel with a large orifice is needed.

This is a lovely book of reproduced patterns of rugs, it also has a section on dyeing, very well presented with lovely photography. It isn't a "how to weave book" but more of setting colour patterns to reproduce the shaker rags (-some of them would fit in beautifully in our modern homes.) You need to know how to weave on a loom already. I really fell in love with quite a few and will try at least one rug. This was supplied to me in return for a honest and unbiased review

I am glad to see this lovely book getting the reviews I think it deserves. It is true that it isn't for someone who doesn't know how to weave and dye already but there are plenty of beginner books out there. Finding a book that goes beyond beginnings in weaving is difficult. The subject matter is specific to the Shaker tradition and it is helpful to have that interest but the subject matter is useful beyond that. The first review made me want to purchase this book because the reviewer isn't a weaver who already knows how to weave. I look for things that can improve and encourage my weaving and dyeing skills.

Weaving Shaker Rugs by Mary Elva Congeton Erf is a free NetGalley ebook that I downloaded and read with Adobe Digital Editions. Intrigued with this style of rug, I wanted to understand this process of creating rugs by hand and see a good deal of impressive designs. I made the immediate mistake of believing that the rugs were all handmade when they're really loomed from hand-dyed material, machine-spun cord, and rug tapes. All of the instruction is quite a bit of a blur from that point on.

This book wasn't exactly what I wanted. No fault of the book, but I am a rug weaver and hoped to find new and clever techniques, which I did not. It was more about history than art.

Can't wait to get started weaving Shaker rugs. My first weaving experiences were at Hancock Shaker Village. This book is perfect for me.
