

Just received this book. Honestly, I think this book is getting more attention than it deserves. First, it copies Humans of New York with dogs, so where is the originality? Second, the photos themselves are about as middle-of-the-road average as you can get. Just shots that any semi-pro or even amateur could take with a decent portrait lens. Most look more like generic micro stock shots of dogs. I'm giving it three stars because the wonderful dogs themselves deserve some credit, and the book organizes the images into fun categories, even though there are way too many of them often crowded onto a page, and most are shot from the same angle, which gets monotonous. It as if the author felt we would be getting more for our money with quantity over quality. If you want great dogs AND great photography by true animal artists who break new ground and whose work is not based on gimmicks, check out any books by these far more deserving artists: Tim Flach ("DOGS"), Lara Jo Regan (DOGS IN CARS or Mr. Winkle books), William Wegman (many titles), Martin Usborne (Where Hunting Dogs Rest). The images in their books are truly beautiful and remarkable, and you

will not tire of the images after seeing the first few.

There isn't anyone else that comes close to what Elias has done with taking photos of dogs. They're focus and gaze in the photo is beautiful.
