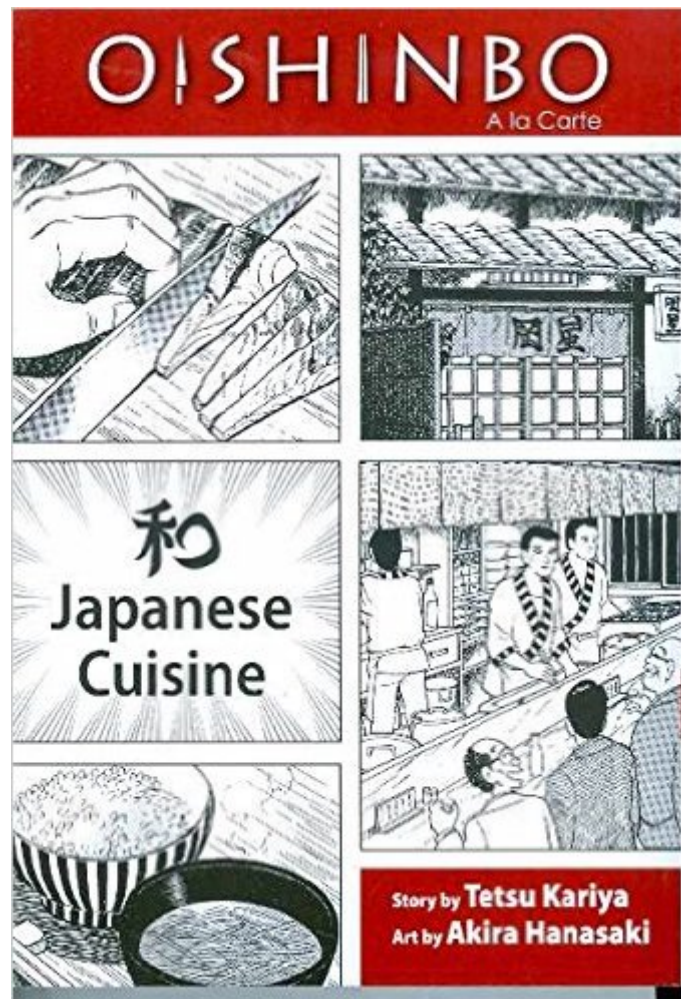

Synopsis
